Kari is excited to join Dr. Khanna's the Initiative and has a strong desire to continuing helping post incarcerated young adults by inviting them to this program. Dr. Surajit Khanna's Post Incarceration Juvenile Justice Reformation Act Initiative provides young adults with a pathway to be reintegrated into society to pursue a new and productive life after being released from incarceration. We have introduced this initiative in New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois, and now Montana. The initiative's planned expansion and rollout is to ALL 50 US States and 3,142 Counties. The first model program has been established in Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania.
